Dear parent/guardian,

Warragul Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Warragul Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2024.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that is through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Some examples of what your contribution has supported Warragul Primary School to do are:

- Continue to provide each student with a personal iPad or notebook in the classroom and continue to upgrade our student digital technology,
- Update our hands on resources for mathematics, science and technology,
- Continue to update our sports and play equipment,
- Update classroom reading libraries across the school,
- Provide specialised art materials in our art classes,
- Provide personal online subscriptions for each child in mathematics, literacy and Seesaw,
- Maintain and develop the school grounds and buildings. Eg. Stables repair and painting project, carpeting the gym building, whole school lighting upgrade.

Every effort has been made to keep costs of book packs and Curriculum Contributions to a minimum. With the increased use of technology, teachers have been able to go through book packs in detail and remove items to reduce the items required in the book packs. Teachers have also gone through the curriculum contribution costs and reduced these where possible.

There are two steps to providing resources for your child for next year:

- 1. Parents supply a book pack. Either purchased through Maxim (see information on page 2) or sourced by parents
- 2. Curriculum contribution paid directly to Warragul Primary School either by direct deposit, cash, eftpos or Compass.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payments Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy, and any other relevant information.

Requests for refunds are to be in writing. Refunds are paid directly into a bank account. They are not paid in cash.

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
